Faron and Snoopy are playing a game where they alternate saying positive integers and a player loses by saying 1. However, they aren't allowed to say a number which can be written as a sum involving previously said numbers. For example, if 4 and 7 have been named, then 15 = 4 + 4 + 7 and 12 = 4 + 4 + 4 are not valid moves but 13 is a valid move. Here is an example of a game where Faron plays first and Snoopy plays second:

Move	New Available Moves
Start of Game	$1,2,3,4,5,6,7,8,9,10,\dots$
F: 4	$1,2,3,5,6,7,9,10,11,13,\dots$
S: 7	1,2,3,5,6,9,10,13,17
F: 9	1,2,3,5,6,10
S: 3	1,2,5
F: 5	1,2
S: 2	1

Snoopy wins the game since Faron is forced to say 1.

Find a friend and play a few games. Try to answer some the following questions:

- 1. If Faron plays 4 and Snoopy plays 3 then the available moves are 1, 2, 5. Who wins and how?
- 2. If Faron plays 4 and Snoopy plays 5 then the available moves are 1, 2, 3, 6, 7, 11. Who wins and how?
- 3. If Faron plays 4 and Snoopy plays 7 then the available moves are 1, 2, 3, 5, 6, 9, 10, 13, 17. Who wins and how?
- 4. If Faron plays 4 and Snoopy plays 6 then the available moves are $1, 2, 3, 5, 7, 9, 11, 13, \ldots$ Who wins and how?
- 5. Is 2 or 3 or 4 or 6 a good first move?
- 6. Could the game go on forever?

An *ender* is a move which is eliminated by every other move. For example, after 4,7 have been played, the remaining moves are 1,2,3,5,6,9,10,13,17 and 17 is an ender.

- 7. Show that if an ender exists, it must be the largest available move.
- 8. Use the strategy stealing idea from Chomp to show that if an ender larger than 1 exists, the player next to move can force a win.

Using problem 6 and some number theory, it is possible to show the following useful fact:

• If the first two moves played share no common factors (other than 1) then Faron can force a win (unless the first two moves are 2 and 3).

For example, if Faron plays 4 and Snoopy plays *any* odd number then Faron can force a win. Play a few more games and try to answer some of the following questions:

9. Is 5 a good first move for Faron?

10. Is 15 a good first move for Faron?
